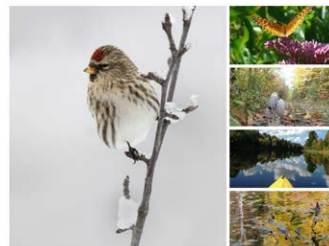
Spiffing up the Macnamara Trail

bookkeeping using Quicken, reporting to the Executive and the Annual Club meeting. You would become a member of the fun and fabulous MFNC Executive!

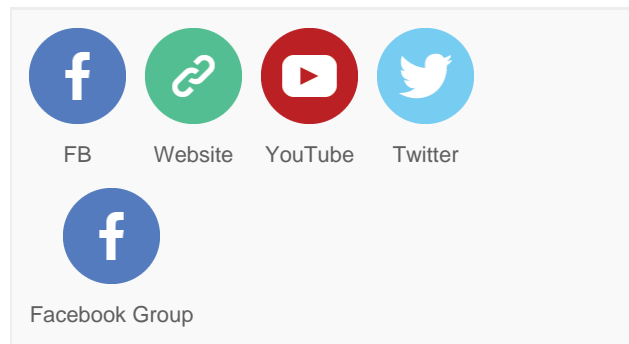
